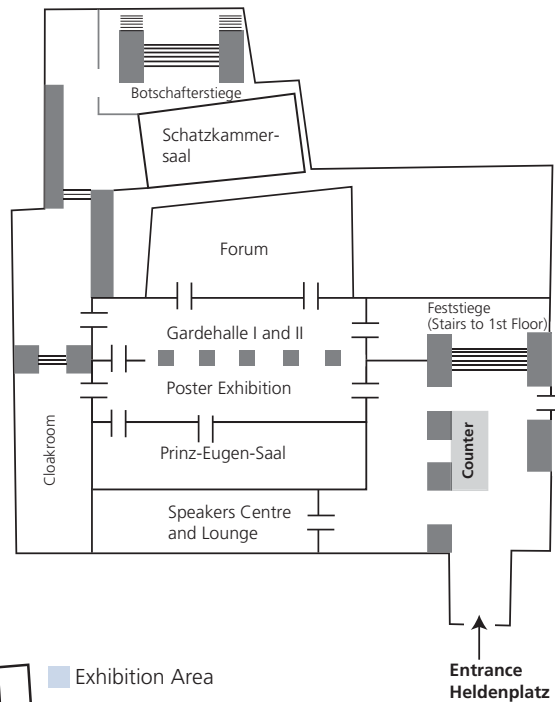

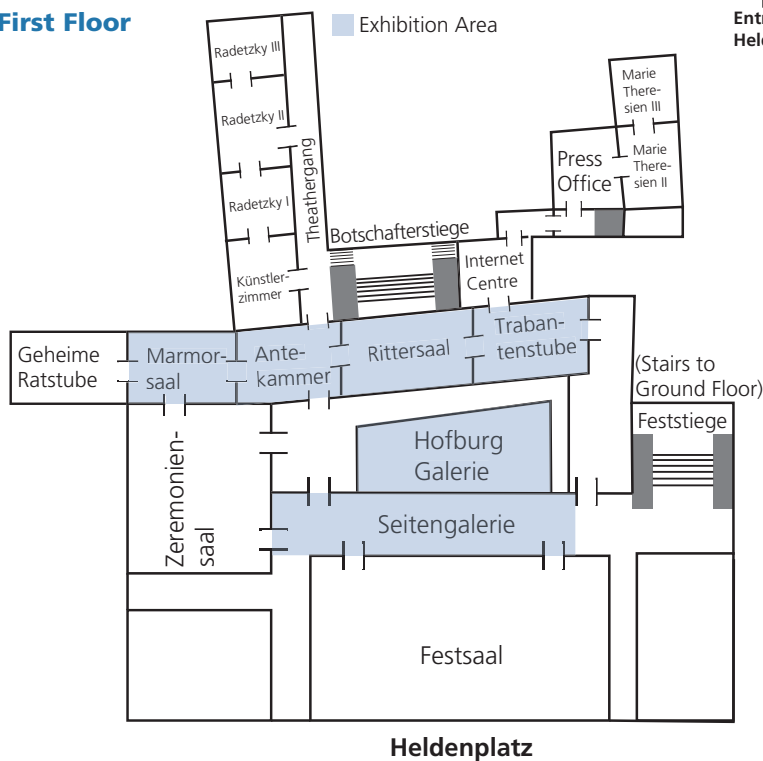

Airport

Vienna International Airport – Schwechat is in 15 km distance to the city centre. The express direct train CAT departs every 30 minutes from the International Airport to the Vienna city centre and takes 16 minutes. A one way ticket costs EUR 9. Within Vienna the Hofburg is easy accessible by public transportation. The taxi fare from the airport to any of the congress hotels and congress venue is expected to be approximately EUR 50.

Car Park

Parking space is available next to the Hofburg Congress Center and participants arriving by car are advised to use these facilities. Parking fees are not included in the registration fee.

Taxis

Taxis are available upon demand in front of the entrance of the Hofburg Congress Center. Participants can also call taxis at the Hofburg Congress Center information counter in the entrance foyer.

Public Transportation Pass

Registered participants receive a public transportation pass in exchange for a voucher which is included in the participants' congress materials. The congress materials can be picked up at the congress counter upon arrival. The public transportation pass is valid for all public transportation during the congress period, i.e. from Sunday, 3 December 2006 through Wednesday, 6 December 2006. 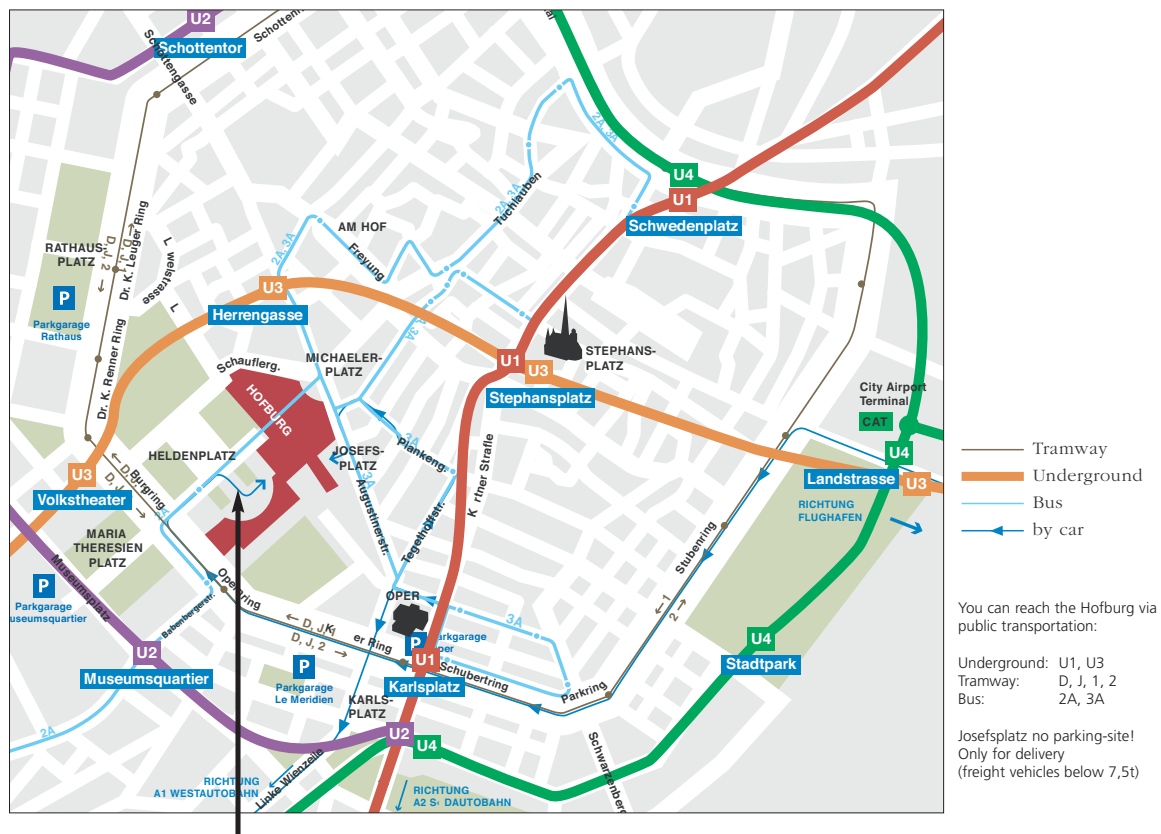

Official ESSM Vienna Sightseeing Tour

This tour includes the main sights and highlights of Vienna. It starts with a drive along the famous Ringstrasse with its magnificent buildings, such as the Vienna State Opera, the Imperial Palace, the Museum of Fine Arts and the Museum of Natural History.



The tour continues to Schönbrunn Palace. The former summer residence of the Habsburg family with its more than 1400 state rooms and the extensive park is a splendid example of Baroque culture. A 45-minute highlight tour takes you to 22 splendid rooms, such as the Grand Gallery and the Chinese Cabinets. After the tour there will be some free time to explore one of the nicest Christmas Markets in Vienna, called Ehrenhof right in front of the palace, this includes a 16 m high illuminated Christmas tree. The Christmas market invites to stroll around the market, taste some hot wine and Austrian Christmas cookies or buy some Christmas gifts there.

On the way back the tour passes by the Belvedere Palace, the former summer residence of Prince Eugen, which houses the largest Gustav Klimt collection in the world.

This tour will start and end at the Vienna Hofburg. Places are limited and will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis.

Structure of the Scientific Program

The scientific program is structured according to days. Per day it is structured by time and room. All presenters are listed by name and the title of their presentation.

Structure of the Abstract Book

The abstract book is structured by session format. The listing starts with the podium session followed by the moderated poster sessions. Hereafter the unmoderated posters are listed according to topics.

FORMAT DESCRIPTIONS

Master Lecture

Each lecture of 30 minutes will be given by a distinguished and renowned expert and will be devoted to a specific topic of major interest.

Round Table

These sessions will usually last 90 minutes. They will focus on a particular topic and present the very latest data related to it. The round table will include a maximum of four papers and time for discussion.

Best Papers

A selection of the year's original scientific publications of particular importance for a specific topic within sexual medicine will be highlighted by the chairpersons during 90 minutes. Each paper will be briefly summarized and discoveries or other information of special interest will be given attention in relation to current knowledge and future perspectives.

Interactive Sessions

These sessions will last 90 minutes and present case discussions with a questioner and a panel of experts. Attendees will be given the possibility to interact actively via a voting system with the faculty of the session.

Debates

Debates last for 60 minutes and are designed to cover controversial issues of a particular topic. The moderator will allow a short introduction for each topic by the respective opponents followed by a discussion on the arguments proposed. Comments, arguments, and questions from the floor are welcomed during the discussion.

Point-Counterpoint Sessions

These sessions are organized to address one controversial issue of a topic. The moderator will allow a brief introduction for each topic by the respective opponents followed by a discussion on the arguments proposed.

Instructional Courses

These 90 minutes sessions present a detailed account of a chosen topic. Courses are designed to provide learning experiences that actively involve participants and will include an opportunity for informal exchange with the faculty.

Podium Sessions

Podium Sessions will present the best abstract papers accepted for the congress by the Scientific Committee and will focus on specific topics presenting the very latest findings in this field. The poster exhibition is scheduled from Monday, 4 December, 2006 to Wednesday, 6 December 2006 and will take place at the Gardehalle I and II on the ground floor of the Hofburg.

Video Surgery Course

The Video Surgery Course on Sunday, 3 December 2006, will last 120 minutes, each video has a duration of 10 to 15 minutes. A panel of selected experts will present surgical videos showing different techniques and approaches and will discuss the details with the participants.

Symposia organised by the Industry in consultation with the Scientific Committee will be presented at the afternoon on Sunday, 3 December 2006 before the Gala Opening and on Monday, 4 December 2006 and Tuesday, 5 December 2006 during lunchtime and in the late afternoon.

Composition

4 ml solution containing: 1000 mg testosterone undecanoate as active ingredient and benzyl benzoate and castor oil as excipients

Contraindications

Cases of known or suspected androgen-dependent carcinoma of the prostate or of the male mammary gland; past or present liver tumors; hypersensitivity to the active substance or to any of the excipients.

Side effects

Administration site: pain and/or hematoma. Possible systemic side effects: diarrhea, leg pain, arthralgia, dizziness, increased sweating, headache, respiratory disorder, acne, breast pain, gynecomastia, pruritus, skin disorder, testicular pain, prostate disorder. Other known adverse drug reactions of treatments containing testosterone are: rare cases of polycythemia, weight gain, electrolyte changes, muscle cramps, nervousness, hostility, depression, sleep apnea, in very rare cases jaundice and liver-function-test abnormalities, various skin reactions including acne, seborrhea, and balding, libido changes, increased frequency of erections, persistent, painful erections (priapism). In prepubertal/pubertal boys testosterone, besides masculinization, can cause accelerated growth and bone maturation and premature epiphyseal closure, thereby reducing final height. The appearance of common acne has to be expected.

Precautions

Nebido might result in a positive finding in doping tests. Older patients treated with androgens may be at an increased risk for the development of prostatic hyperplasia. Carcinoma of the prostate has to be excluded before starting treatment with testosterone preparations. Regular examinations of the prostate are recommended. Hemoglobin and haematocrit should be checked periodically in patients on long-term androgen treatment to detect cases of polycythemia. In rare cases, benign liver tumors, and even more rarely, malignant liver tumors have been reported in users of testosterone compounds. Nebido is strictly for intramuscular injection and must be injected very slowly. Special care must be given to avoid intravascular injection. The first injection interval may be reduced to a minimum of 6 weeks. With this loading dose, steady-state levels will be reached quickly.

Special warnings

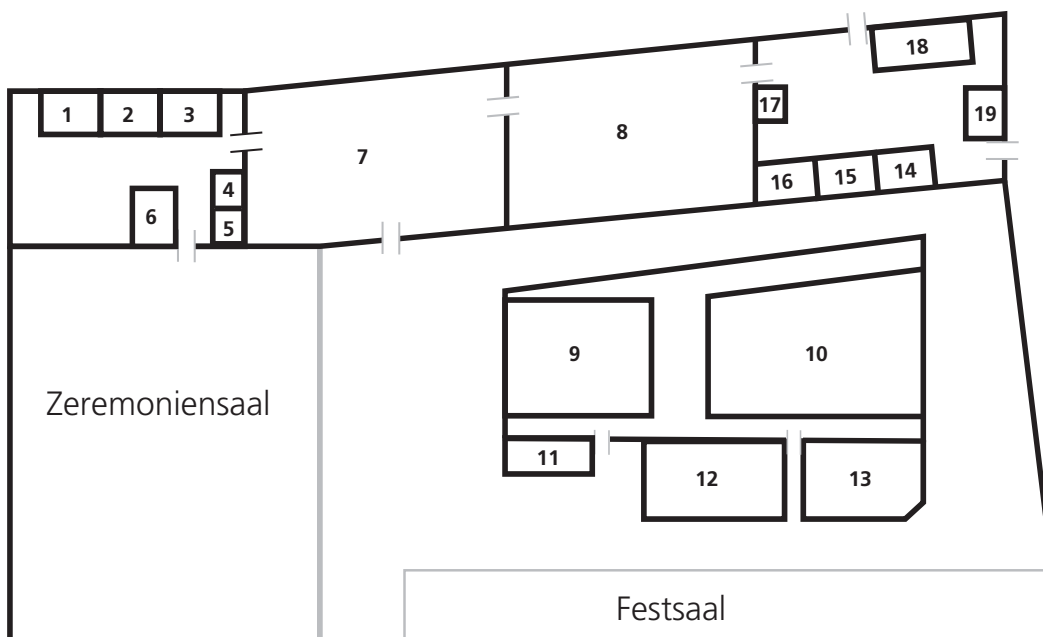
